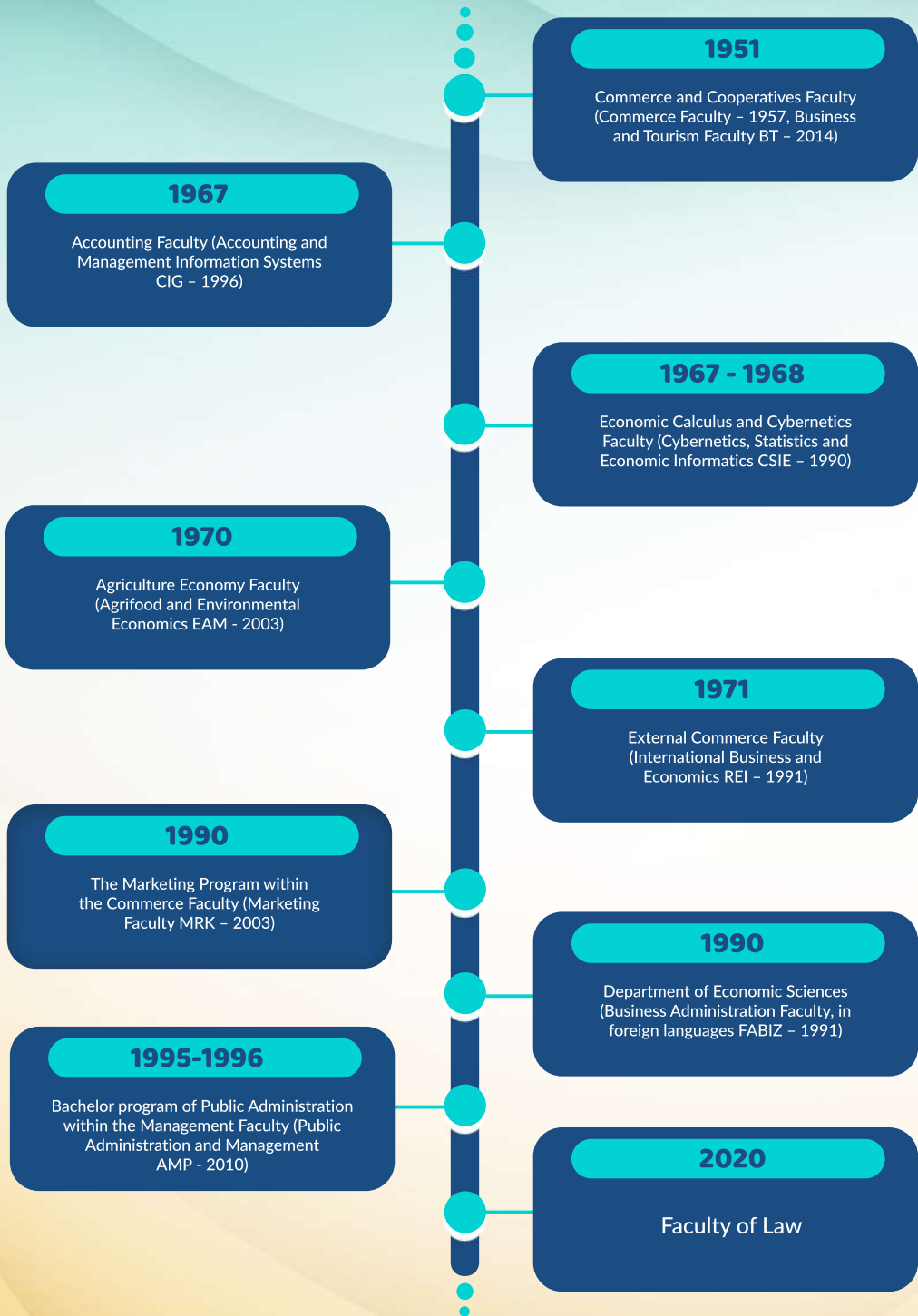

CHAPTER 2

ACADEMIC LIFE

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ACADEMIC GENERALITIES

Our university has fully implemented the Bologna system based on three main programmes: Bachelor, Masters, PhD

BACHELOR'S PROGRAMMES

These study programmes are 3 years long (6 semesters) and are assigned 180 ECTS. For admission, applicants must hold a Baccalaureate Diploma or an equivalent, such as a high school degree that allows for the continuation of studies within a higher education institution.

MASTERS' PROGRAMMES

Master's programmes are 2 years long (4 semesters) and are assigned 120 ECTS. For admission, applicants must hold a Bachelor's Diploma or an equivalent. The programmes can be focused on research or on developing specialised professional competences. The academic offer includes 3 international MBA programs, organised in cooperation with foreign partners.

DOCTORAL SCHOOL

The university supports PhD. research corresponding to key areas covered by research centres within each faculty. Generally, PhD studies are 3 years long and are open to Masters' degree holders.

The Academic Structure

The academic year has two semesters. The first semester starts at the beginning of October and is completed by mid-February. The second semester runs from late February to late June. The exact duration of each specific programme can be checked with the individual programme outline. The two regular examination periods are at end of January – beginning of February and end of May – mid-June. The re-examination session takes place in the second half of June – beginning of July.

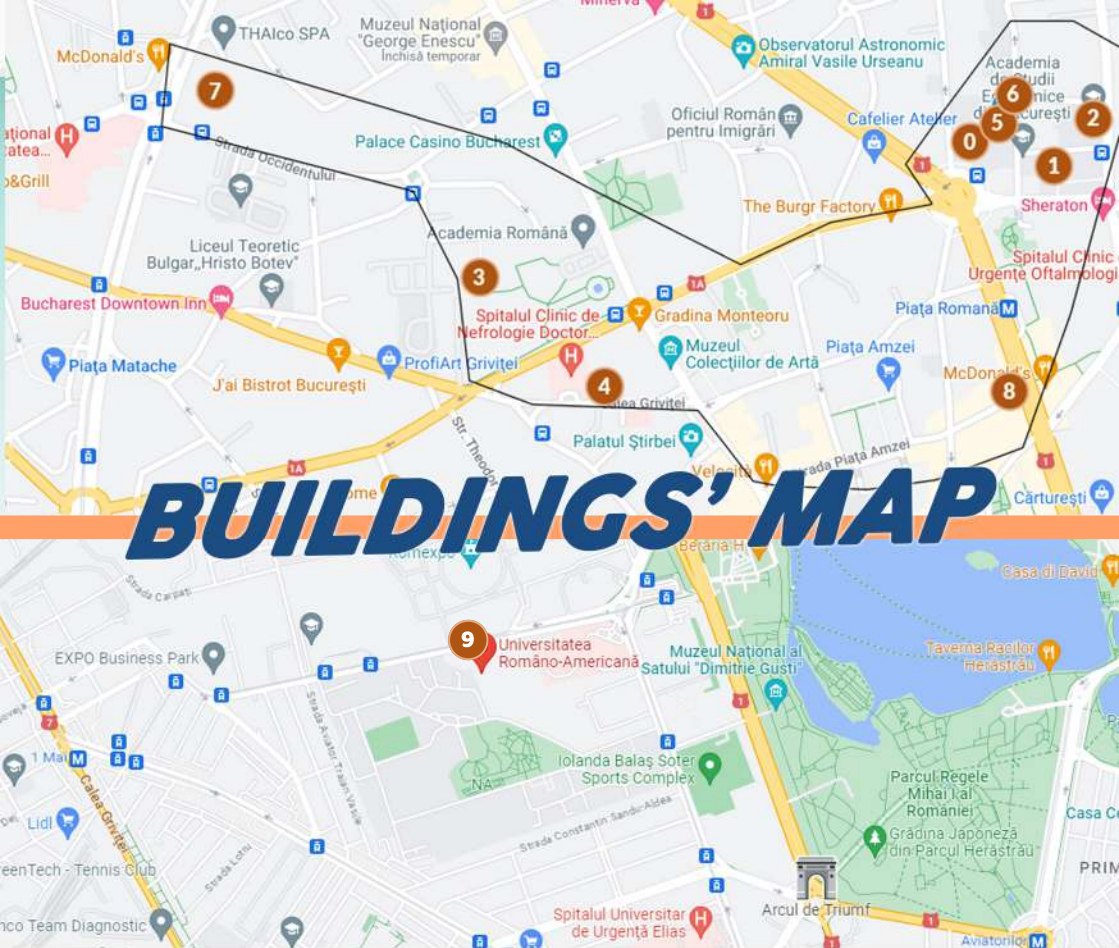

ROMANIAN-AMERICAN UNIVERSITY BUILDING (URA)

Exhibition Boulevard 1B

The Bucharest University of Economic Studies holds classes in buildings B and C of the Romanian-American University during the renovations of the Mihai Eminescu building. The classrooms are numbered in the YZ format, where Y - represents the floor and Z - represents the room number.



READING THE TIMETABLE

SINCE EACH ACADEMIC YEAR is divided into 2 semesters and each semester has a different set of courses and associated seminars, it only makes sense that each semester has a different timetable. The corresponding one for the first semester is published a few days prior to the beginning of the academic year, either or both on the news faculty board or on the faculty's website.

YOU SHOULD KEEP IN MIND THAT during the first week of the semester some changes may be made in your timetable, so check the board of your faculty. All the students from the same year of study are divided into series and each series is divided into up to 8 groups.

THE COURSES ARE WEEKLY ACTIVITIES

The courses are weekly activities and they are a whole series activity. Some have mandatory attendance and some don't, depending on the professor's preference. It is, of course, advisable to attend all courses.

SEMINARS ON THE OTHER HAND place either every week or once in every weeks. They are a group activity and have a practical allure. The attendance is mandatory and usually essential in order to pass the course.

The activity which will take place once every two weeks will be marked by a diagonal line in the box corresponding to that seminar. The subjects that are written above that line will take place in the odd weeks (the 1st week, the 3rd week, the 5th week etc.), while the ones that are written under that line will take place in the even weeks (the 2nd week, the 4th week, the 6th week etc.).



EVALUATION & GRADING

Academic grading in Romania

10-point grading scale is used.
For passing, the minimum grade is 5.

COURSE VS SEMINAR

One discipline will be divided into courses and seminars. The mark that you get in seminars represents 30%-40% out of the final mark, while the mark from courses represents 60%-70% of the final mark. The split may differ among courses and will be presented by each course's professor at the beginning of the semester.

ECTS

The Bucharest University of Economic Studies works based on the European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System, as part of the Bologna Educational System. Each semester's courses comprise a maximum of 30 ECTS. In order to pass from the first to the second year of Bachelor studies you need a minimum of 30 ECTS at the end of the first academic year (out of the total of 60 ECTS you can get throughout the year). In order to pass from the 2nd to the 3rd year, you need 75 ECTS (out of the total 120 ECTS corresponding to the first 2 years) and in order to enroll for the Bachelor thesis you need all the 180 ECTS.

HOW WILL YOU BE ASSESSED?

The academic year is divided into 2 semesters, each one of them consisting in 14 teaching weeks. At the end of each semester, 3 weeks are assigned students examination, consisting usually in written papers. At the end of the academic year there will be another 2 weeks period of re-evaluation, intended for the ones who want to improve their marks or for the ones who didn't pass an exam and need to re-sit exams. In order to pass in a course and get the corresponding number of ECTS, you need to get at least 50% (translated into mark 5).

***The final mark is calculated taking into consideration the seminar points and the final exam mark.**

As a student of the Bucharest University of Economic Studies, you benefit from a personal page which includes all of your identification data.

HOW DO I ACCESS MY PERSONAL PAGE?

The aim of The Management System of Electronic Identity (IDM) implemented in Bucharest University of Economic Studies is using a single username and a single password in order to get access to all the resources provided by our university. The activation of the IDM account that will help you access your personal page. In order to follow the instructions, we recommend you to ask a Romanian student, the International Relations Department or the Networks Service - room 2000A.

HOW DOES THE PERSONAL PAGE HELP ME?

The facilities of your personal page include your timetable, the planning of your exams and your grades. Moreover, on your personal page you will find information about the fees with which you are due (tuition fees or dormitories fees, in case you obtain a place in the university's dormitories). In addition to that, on the personal page you can find several announcements that may be of interest.

WHICH ARE THE SITUATIONS WHEN THE PERSONAL PAGE CANNOT BE USED?

In case you are living in one of the university dormitories and you are not paying the monthly rent, the access to your personal page will be blocked. In case this thing happens, for unlocking your personal page, you will have to go with the receipt or document which certified that you have paid your debts to the Social Direction from the Cihoschi Building, room 5104 at the 1st floor. In case you cannot access it from different reasons, ask for help from your faculty's secretary's office or contact the Networks Service within ASE (room 2000A).

As a student of the Bucharest University of Economic Studies, you benefit from a personal page which includes all of your identification data.

LIBRARIES IN ASE

The university libraries focus on developing student's global knowledge of the socio-economic field by continually and extensively enriching their collections. The virtual library was established in 2002 and since then it has been one of the focus points of the development process.

ASE libraries are located in Piata Romana and in the Moxa Campus. The library is open from Monday to Friday, between 8:00 and 15:30, offering access to paper and digital resources.

The virtual library allows access to more than 155.000 books, 263 ancient books, more than 1000 full-text articles issued in ASE publications, more than 7000 PhD theses, as well as national and international data bases and publications. The most requested publications are on free access in the library rooms (they are classified according to the Dewey system). Due to the large number of publications, for some of them the access is indirect, through the librarian.

Cihoschi

The Cihoschi canteen is open from Monday to Friday, between 12:30 and 15:00. A complete meal (2 dishes and a desert) would cost approximately 20 lei.

MEDICAL SERVICES

All international students are required to have a medical insurance valid for the entire period of studies with ASE – either the European health card or a private insurance.

Medical examinations are free at ASE students' cabinets and they are carried out at the doctor's studio (Moxa campus) – general physician (3 doctors and 5 nurses) and dentist (4 doctors and 3 nurses) offices. Specialist examinations must be requested by your general physician and will be carried out in a specialised unit.

The doctors are available from Monday to Friday, between 08:00 and 19:00. The medical office can be contacted at **021.319.19.00**, interior **541**.

EU students with EU health card or Health Certificate can go directly to the general doctors they have chosen. Some consultation or investigations might be subject to special fees (partial or no payment from your insurance). In case of emergency situations, the number 112 is available nationwide, free of charge in any telecom network. All hospitals have an emergency room, available 24 hours a day. The service is generally free and open to everybody.

SPORT FACILITIES

With regards to sports, ASE's students can choose from a wide array of physical activities, including basketball, volleyball, football, weight lifting, tennis, chess, cheer-leading and many more.

ASE's sports facilities are properly equipped and offer students the chance to practice team sports and individual sports at no cost. Sports are included in the curriculum for the first two years of study.

The 14 sports facilities are placed in the proximity of ASE campuses with the aim of encouraging students to have a healthy lifestyle: A sports hall situated near Piata Romană (Stanislas Cihoschi Str. 7): courts for indoor basketball, volleyball, tennis, aerobics, fitness and bodybuilding,
