The Bucharest University of Economic Studies (ASE) is Romania's leading institution for higher education in economics and one of the most prestigious universities in Southeast Europe.

The idea of its establishment emerged at the beginning of the 20th century, when a group of Romanian economists, educated in Western universities and supported by Minister Nicolae D. Xenopol, championed the creation of a modern school of economics.

Thus, on April 6, 1913, through Royal Decree no. 2978, the Academy of Higher Commercial and Industrial Studies (AISCI) was founded, the first university center in Romania devoted exclusively to the economic sciences.

From its earliest years, under the guidance of renowned figures such as Gheorghe Tașcă, Virgil Madgearu, and Victor Slăvescu, the Academy became a center of academic training and research, successfully adapting Western models to Romanian realities. In 1967, it was officially given its current name: the Bucharest University of Economic Studies.

Its main building, constructed between 1924 and 1926 in Piața Romană, is home to the celebrated fresco "The History of Romanian Commerce" by Cecilia Cuțescu-Storck, a lasting symbol of the deep connection between economics, art, and national identity.

Over the decades, ASE has educated tens of thousands of economists, managers, diplomats, and leaders, shaping the development of economic education and research in Romania. Since 1997, it has held the status of Doctoral Degree-Granting Institution, and in 2013, on the occasion of its centenary, it was awarded the Order "Merit for Education".

Today, ASE comprises 13 faculties, offering a wide range of bachelor's, master's, and doctoral programs, as well as research centers, international partnerships, and postgraduate academic programs.

The university plays a vital role in integrating the Romanian economy into the global network of knowledge and innovation, while remaining faithful to its mission as a promoter of academic excellence, free thought, and social progress.

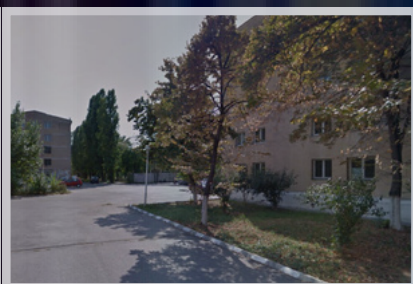
## S2:E2 “ACCOMMODATION OPPORTUNITIES”

Life in Bucharest has never been easier! The Bucharest University of Economic Studies offers its students the best conditions in its 7 campuses: **Moxa Complex, Belvedere Nou Complex, Tei C1, Belvedere Vechi Complex, Agronomie Complex, Vitan Dormitory, and Occidentului Dormitory** (for doctoral students). Currently, foreign students can be accommodated in Agronomie Complex and Vitan Dormitory.

**The Student Accommodation Bureau** ([www.cazare.ase.ro](http://www.cazare.ase.ro)) is a structure under the **Social Directorate** and operates under the aegis of the Bucharest University of Economic Studies. Its responsibilities include providing the logistics of the accommodation process, carrying out redistribution procedures, as well as housing international students.

### The Student Accommodation Service is responsible for:

- **Accommodation logistics:** here social and medical files are submitted and registered, as well as redistribution requests, which are forwarded to the Accommodation Committee.
- **Redistribution procedures:** monthly (November–April) redistribution or exchange requests may be submitted, which are then processed.
- **Contract termination requests:** students who wish to give up their dormitory place may submit a request to terminate their contract. Contracts cannot be terminated in the first semester except in exceptional cases, as provided in the Accommodation Methodology.
- **Housing of international students:** requests approved by the International Student Office are submitted to the Accommodation Service for processing.
- **Dormitory inspections:** periodic checks to identify students who have transferred their accommodation rights. Students are required to allow access to the Control Committee and present their dormitory ID.
- **Handling complaints:** applying disciplinary sanctions provided in the Regulations, as well as managing complaints related to roommates or dormitory conditions.





## **Agronomie Complex - Second Degree of Comfort**

Agronomie Complex is the ideal choice for students who want peace and quick access to various services. Nearby there is a 24/7 supermarket, a laundry, sports fields, and recreational areas.

Dormitory C1 is for female students, and C2 is for male students. Both are classified as Second Degree of Comfort, with three-person rooms and shared bathrooms on the floor.

The complex is about 20 minutes' walk from 1 Mai metro station.

## **Vitan Dormitory - Second Degree of Comfort**

Vitan Dormitory is dedicated exclusively to international students and offers a multicultural environment, ideal for making international friendships. It is a mixed dormitory, with two-person rooms and shared bathrooms on the floor. It is located 20 minutes' walk from Dristor metro station, close to gyms and hypermarkets.

The student representative is elected by vote and has the mission to defend and support the interests of their colleagues within the decision-making and consultative structures of the Bucharest University of Economic Studies (ASE). They actively participate in improving student life by bringing forward the issues and proposals of students. Students are full members of the university community and active partners in ASE's management, contributing to the process of ensuring the quality of education by constantly monitoring and evaluating academic and administrative activities, which place students at the center of the university.

#### **Student representatives may be:**

- Group representatives
- Series representatives
- Student representatives in the Faculty Council
- Student representatives in the University Senate

#### **Responsibilities of a student representative:**

- Participating in various committees
- Representing ASE outside the institution
- Attending official meetings
- Maintaining a stable relationship with faculty members
- Informing colleagues about decisions made
- Representing the common interests of students
- Guiding the students they represent

#### **How does the election process work?**

- The group leader is elected internally, directly within the group.
- The series leader is elected by vote, in the presence of delegates from the Electoral Office.
- Representatives in the Faculty Council and the University Senate must submit their candidacy (CV and letter of intent) to **office@us.ase.ro**. Afterwards, students of the faculty vote online on the Webstudent platform.

All information about the election process and the voting calendar is published on the official website: **us.ase.ro**.

#### **What is the Student Senate?**

The Student Senate is the highest form of student representation, consisting of representatives from all faculties, programs, and study cycles of ASE. Its main purpose is to defend the interests, rights, and values of the entire student community.



Students of the Bucharest University of Economic Studies (ASE) have access to their personal page, which includes personal data, enrolled study programs, the corresponding funding type, as well as their class timetable and electronic grade records.

In addition, ASE students can access the ASE Online platform at [www.online.ase.ro](http://www.online.ase.ro), where they will find the courses they are enrolled in, along with teaching materials uploaded by academic staff. Through this platform, students may take tests and exams, or upload practical assignments, projects, and homework.

**With the IDM account, students may access multiple ASE services:**

- **webstudent.ase.ro** – the student’s personal webpage;
- **ASE Secure Wi-Fi** network within the campus;
- **<https://plationline.ase.ro>** – the official online payment platform for ASE fees, accessible both via authenticated login and through the “online cashier” mode;
- **[www.online.ase.ro](http://www.online.ase.ro)**;
- **<https://selfportal.ase.ro/>** – platform for password reset, in case login credentials are forgotten;
- Other services currently under development.

**Beyond ASE’s institutional services, the IDM account also offers additional benefits that enhance student life, such as:**

- **Spotify Student Subscription** – providing a significant discount for students;
- **Office 365 Package** – offered free of charge and accessible through the IDM account;
- **Enformation** – an online resource providing access to data, statistics, and official documents useful for projects, research, Bachelor’s theses, or Master’s dissertations.

The institutional student e-mail follows the format: **IDM@stud.ase.ro**, accessible via mail.google.com by entering the full e-mail address in the “email or phone” field and the assigned password.

The student e-mail is integrated within the allocated student group. As it is connected to Google for Education services, professors can send invitations to Google Meet or Google Classroom directly to this institutional address.





**The Bucharest University of Economic Studies** provides students with countless resources, both physical and electronic, through its libraries, which helps them have a more prolific academic career by assimilating information from countless fields.

**Thus, students already benefit from access to over 600 seats** in the reading rooms (central unit, branches and campus, as well as departmental branches), where both the collection of materials, such as monographic publications, periodicals, electronic resources and electronic collections, full-text databases, and the recommended bibliography can be found. All of this is at the students' disposal, access to these reading rooms and to the subject sheets being allowed based on the student ID card issued by the faculty secretariats.

**Access to the library resources** in the Ion Angelescu central unit, as well as those in the branch libraries, is based on the student ID card, regardless of the academic cycle you are in (bachelor's, master's, doctorate, postgraduate studies), and can be used according to the aforementioned specifics. Students can consult books, magazines, digital documents or benefit from access to several bibliographic databases, access to the latter being allowed based on the personal account.

To make it easier to find textbooks and books on library shelves, this entire stream is uploaded to the central online access and can be viewed directly at: <https://biblioteca.ase.ro/sali-de-lectura>.

Students also benefit from additional support through the **Anelis Plus** project, through which databases such as **Elsevier, Clarivate Analytics, ProQuest, Scopus, Emerald, EBSCO** are made available to them.

In the same direction of supporting students, the **BUES** Library offers access to scientific databases, with full-text and bibliometric journals, e-book collections, as well as access to scientific indexing platforms. Among the databases available to BUES students are the following: **Science Direct, Emerald Journals, ProQuest, Scopus, SciVal, Web of Knowledge (Clarivate Analytics), Elsevier, Clarivate Analytics-Web of Science, EnClites Innovations Index, Journal Citation Reports, Clarivate Analytics-Web of Science, EnClites Innovations Index, Journal Citation Reports, ProQuest, JSTOR, CEOL, CAB, Computer Passport, etc.**

The libraries also offer electronic access to bibliographic materials admitted to the master's degree, access to legal databases or reference resources regarding administrative documents of state institutions.



Access to these electronic resources is achieved both through the **Anelis Plus** portal established for all students of our university, and directly through personal accounts configured on these platforms, based on the credentials provided by the university.

We recommend using these resources for academic documentation, for planning each academic session, but also for mastering the best research techniques.

Additional resources available: **BUES courses and manuals, PhD thesis abstracts, BUES Journal**. To access some electronic services, authentication in the library information system is mandatory, at the web address: <http://opac.biblioteca.ase.ro/opac>, authentication being performed using the IDM user and password.

By accessing the online library, users benefit from a multitude of academic materials, such as university courses, books and applicative works, textbooks, books and applicative works from various publishers, recommended in the bibliography of current exams. These include titles specific for each faculty, publications available in fields such as digital, renowned economists and prominent personalities in the socio-economic field, as well as many other resources.

**In order to benefit from the library's available services in digital format, a mobile access account is required, which is created as follows:**

- Access the website: [www.e-nformation.ro](http://www.e-nformation.ro), then click on Create account.
- Enter the requested data.
- You will receive an e-mail to validate the account. Also check the "bulk"/spam box in case the message does not reach your inbox.
- Choose the institution, faculty, and field you represent.
- If all the information is correct, the registration will be completed, and the account will be automatically activated. If you have entered the wrong personal e-mail data, the account will not be activated within 24 hours of registration. You will need to create a new account and be careful to the correctness of the data entered.
- Send the completed certificate to the e-mail address: [events@e-nformation.ro](mailto:events@e-nformation.ro).





## ASE Canteens - Where can we eat?

For lunch, students of the Bucharest University of Economic Studies can choose to eat at one of the two university canteens: Moxa Canteen (11 Mihail Moxa Street) or Cihoschi Canteen (5 Stanisław Cihoschi Street, near Piața Romană). Both canteens offer fresh and diverse menus throughout the academic year, at prices more affordable compared to restaurants in the area.

At **Moxa Canteen**, students benefit from special prices, with a full menu costing around 15 lei, while at **Cihoschi Canteen** the menus are richer, but slightly more expensive, with teaching staff having priority at serving.

ASE students benefit from free medical services provided by the university's medical offices, located on campus. These offices offer both general medical consultations and dental treatments, supporting students' health and well-being.

**The two offices are open Monday to Friday, between 08:00 - 19:00.**

**The General Medicine Office**, located on the ground floor of **Moxa D Dormitory**, provides consultations, treatments, medical certificates, and assistance for sports competitions. At the first visit, students must present their **student ID** or another document proving their student status at ASE in order to receive a medical file number and be assigned a doctor.

It is important to note that any medical letter issued by a family doctor or specialist must first **be presented to the university's medical office** before being submitted to professors or faculty offices to justify absences from physical education classes.

The same rule applies to medical files submitted to the **Student Housing Service** for obtaining a dormitory place on medical grounds, they must be validated by the university's medical office.

**The Dental Office**, located in the **Moxa Canteen building**, offers consultations and treatments provided by three doctors and two nurses. Services are free of charge for ASE students (with proof of student status, such as a student ID), provided they are under the age of 26.

Free dental treatments include fillings, root canal treatments, extractions, as well as preventive procedures.

According to the Law, all students under the age of 30 are entitled to a 90% discount on the purchase of public transportation tickets. At the beginning of each cycle of studies (Bachelor's, Master's, and Doctoral level), students receive a special transport pass, serving as proof of enrollment in the higher education system. This pass must be validated annually by the faculty secretariat.

### **STB (Bucharest Transport Company):**

- Type of transport: **Bus, trolleybus, tram;**
- Purchase of subscription: At STB ticket offices;
- Discount: Yes, by reimbursement through the **"Scholarships and Other Financial Rights" Office at ASE**. In order to obtain the discount, the stamped receipt (stamped on the back by the STB cashier) must be sent **within the first 15 days of the month to the e-mail address [burse@ase.ro](mailto:burse@ase.ro)**, together with the student's **identification data**: full name, faculty, study program, year and group, as well as the personal numerical code (CNP).
- Important: At the first request for reimbursement, a copy of an identity document and a **bank account statement** must also be attached in order to be registered in the database.

### **Metrorex (Subway Company):**

- Type of transport: **Subway;**
- Purchase of discounted subscription: At designated Metrorex ticket offices (a complete list of such offices can be found on the official website, under "Points of Sale for Travel Titles");
- Discount: Yes, granted at ticket offices, upon presentation of the **validated transport pass and a valid identity document**.

### **CFR Căători (Romanian Railways - Passenger Division):**

- Type of transport: **Train;**
- Discount: Yes, granted at ticket offices, upon presentation of the **CFR-issued student ID and a valid identity document**.
- Purchase of discounted subscription: At railway station ticket offices, based on the CFR-issued student ID.
- In order to benefit from reduced fares, students must obtain annually, on the basis of the validated transport pass, a **CFR Student ID**, directly at railway station ticket offices. After obtaining the CFR Student ID, the student must register it on the website when purchasing tickets online, or present it to the CFR cashier when purchasing physical tickets, in order to benefit from the discount.

The scholarship system is one of the most important ways through which the university supports students, whether for academic performance, extracurricular activities, or special social circumstances. The Bucharest University of Economic Studies (ASE) is known for offering some of the highest scholarship amounts in the country, aiming to encourage students' academic path and to ensure access to education. If you are an ASE student, you can benefit from several types of scholarships:

#### **Olympic Excellence Scholarships (Level I / International)**

- Awarded to first-year students enrolled in state universities who won 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place at international school olympiads recognized by the Ministry of Education.
- These scholarships are maintained throughout the entire undergraduate program, provided the student achieves a yearly GPA of at least 9.00.

#### **Performance Scholarships**

Granted to students enrolled in full-time bachelor's and master's programs, as follows:

- a) **Academic Performance Scholarships** - awarded to 3% of the total number of state-funded students at bachelor's and master's level, based on outstanding academic results.
- b) **Study Scholarships** - awarded to full-time bachelor's and master's students, depending on the budget funds available at faculty level.

These are granted as follows:

- For 1st-year bachelor's and master's students: based on the admission exam grades;
- For 2nd, 3rd, and 4th-year bachelor's students, and 2nd-year master's students: based on academic performance in the previous year, ranked by GPA, calculated as a weighted average of grades and ECTS credits.

- c) **Research Performance Scholarships** - one per faculty, regardless of the program (bachelor's or master's), awarded through competition for one academic year, based on the highest score obtained according to the official evaluation grid (Annex 1(a)).

To be eligible for the scholarships listed under Art. 4., paragraph (1), letter b), students must be full-time students with no failed exams; have a minimum GPA of 9.00 for all years of study (for 1st-year master's students, the admission GPA must be at least 9.00).



### **Special Scholarships for Outstanding Results in Cultural and Organizational Activities**

These are awarded through a competition for one academic year, based on the highest score obtained by the candidate according to the scoring grid used for granting these scholarships (Annex 1(b)).

Students wishing to apply for this type of scholarship must be full-time students with a general average of at least 8.00 for their years of study (first-year master's students must have an admission average of at least 8.00).

### **Performance Scholarships for Involvement in Extracurricular Activities at ASE Bucharest**

For one academic year, for full-time students enrolled in bachelor's and master's programs, financed by the state budget, who participate in activities that benefit the university.

### **Social Scholarships**

These are granted upon request for the legal duration of the study program, until the age of 35, within a limit of 30% of the total scholarship fund allocated to the faculty, to full-time students financed by the state budget, from bachelor's and master's programs, who provide original or certified copies of documents proving they fall into one of the following categories:

- a) Orphan students, students from children's homes, single-parent families, or those in foster care;
- b) Students registered with the ASE Student Dispensary who provide medical certificates, certified by the dispensary, proving they suffer from conditions specified in the methodology;
- c) Students whose family's average net monthly income per family member in the 12 months prior to the beginning of the semester/academic year is lower than the minimum net basic salary in the country.

### **Sports Performance Scholarships (one per faculty)**

May be granted to students who have achieved outstanding sports performance, through a competition, for one academic year, for bachelor's students in years II and III, or year IV in the case of Law students, and for master's students in years I and II.

Within the limits of available own funds, ASE Bucharest may grant full-time students from state-funded bachelor's programs (years II and III, or year IV in the Faculty of Law) and master's programs (years I and II) excellence scholarships for remarkable achievements in extracurricular, scientific, cultural, and sports activities, as follows:

- a) The "Mihail Manoilescu" Scholarship for the entire professional, scientific research, organizational, cultural, and sports activity;
- b) 5 scholarships for outstanding performance in organizational and cultural activities;
- c) 24 scholarships for outstanding results in research activities;
- d) Other special scholarships.

If, during an academic year, students benefit from scholarships and request withdrawal from university courses or are expelled, they are required to return the amounts received. The methodology regarding the awarding of scholarships and other forms of social support for full-time students in the 2025-2026 academic year can be consulted at:

### S3:E3 “THE ECONOMIST LEAGUE”

The Economist League is the inter-faculty soccer championship of the Bucharest Academy of Economic Studies. The distinctive feature of this competition is that the teams are made up of both students and teaching staff. The matches are played in a 7-a-side format, with the rule that at least two teachers must be on the field throughout the game. This approach aims to strengthen cohesion between students and teachers, as well as to facilitate interaction between students from different faculties, with a view to developing a climate of collaboration and mutual understanding.

Now in its 16th edition, in the 2025-2026 season, the competition brings together all twelve faculties of the Bucharest Academy of Economic Studies, each ready to enter the game. Beyond the main championship, the event also includes two derivative competitions: the Economist's Cup, held in a knockout system, and the Economist's Super Cup, designed to add extra spectacle and competitiveness.

The history of the League began in April 2008, and since then, with the exception of the period affected by the pandemic, this sporting tradition has continued uninterrupted, becoming a symbol of team spirit and collaboration between students and teachers. The most successful teams in this competition are:

**Faculty of Theoretical and Applied Economics: 8 Championship titles, 5 Cups, and 5 Super Cups;**

**Faculty of Agro-food and Environmental Economics: 3 Championship titles and 3 Cups;**

**Faculty of Cybernetics, Statistics and Economic Informatics: 2 Championship titles, 3 Cups, and 2 Super Cups;**

**Faculty of Management: 1 Championship title and 2 Super Cups;**

**Faculty of Marketing: 1 Cup;**

**Faculty of Finance, Insurance, Banking and Capital Markets: 1 Cup.**

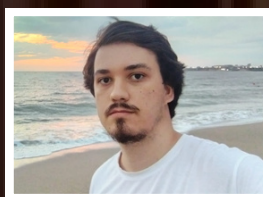
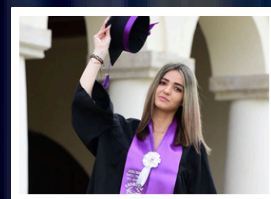

# S3:E5 “ESSENTIAL STEPS IN YOUR STUDENT JOURNEY”

## About the Timetable

Initially, your study schedule might seem complicated: numerous courses, columns, and abbreviations that are hard to decipher. We all go through this, but after a few weeks, things start to make sense.

The timetable is published a few days before the semester begins. It details your subjects, which are organized into groups (of around 25 students) and series (which include several groups).

- Lectures (C) are held for the entire series, last 80 minutes, and account for 50-70% of your final grade. This is where the theoretical foundation is built.
- Seminars (S) are held in smaller groups, also last 80 minutes, and can be weekly (taking the full cell in the timetable) or bi-weekly (with odd weeks in the top half of the cell and even weeks in the bottom half). They focus on the practical part and contribute 30-50% to the final grade.

If you don't pass a subject at the end of the semester, it becomes a backlog course that must be retaken during the July Re-examination session. If you don't pass it then either, you will have to retake it the following year. The course/seminar grading ratio may vary depending on the professor, which is why the first week is crucial for understanding each subject's structure, passing requirements, and grade distribution.

## About Subjects

Throughout your studies, you will encounter three types of subjects:

- Compulsory: These form the core foundation of your academic training and cover the essential disciplines for your field. They are mandatory to complete.
- Optional: These are included in the curriculum and are mandatory to take, but you can choose from a list provided by the university. For the next academic year, you can select up to 3 preferences from each package, in order of priority. You will be allocated to and attend only one from each list.
- Elective: These are also included in the curriculum but are not mandatory. You can take them only if you wish to explore a field further. They are not required for passing the academic year.

The selection of optional and elective subjects is done via the WebStudent platform, under the “Optionals” section, during the period specified in the academic calendar.



## Exam Session

At the end of each semester, after 14 weeks of academic activities, the **exam session** takes place. It lasts three weeks and is dedicated to evaluating the knowledge acquired in each course. Depending on the subject, exams may be written, oral, or project-based.

The exam schedule is published in advance, allowing students to plan their study time. This session is essential for passing courses and obtaining the corresponding credit points.

## Re-examination Session

If a student does not pass a course during the regular exam session, they have the opportunity to take the **re-examination session**, which is held once per academic year, in July. During this period, students can retake exams for failed courses, providing another chance to earn a passing grade and the allocated credit points.

The fee for a failed course is 100 lei and can be paid at the cashier or online via the platform **plationline.ase.ro**. If a student was absent from the exam during the regular session, the re-examination fee for the same academic year does not apply.

During the re-examination session, students may also request grade improvement evaluations for up to two courses already passed in the same academic year. Only students with no pending exams may participate in these evaluations, and the fee for a grade improvement is 50 lei.

## Credit Points

Credit points (or ECTS credits) represent an international standard used to measure the workload required for a subject, reflecting its volume, difficulty, and the number of study hours. They are essential for study equivalence and international diploma recognition.

Each semester is worth a total of 30 ECTS credits. Credits are all-or-nothing: you either pass the subject and receive all the points, or if you fail (achieving less than a grade 5), you receive no credits for that subject.



## **Are You Ready for an International Experience?**

Do you want to travel, explore new cultures, learn a foreign language, and make friends from all around the world? If your answer is “yes”, the Bucharest University of Economic Studies (ASE) offers you the opportunity to study abroad through the Erasmus Plus program. Through an Erasmus Plus mobility, you can spend either one semester or an entire academic year at a well-known international university.

## **Who Can Apply?**

To be eligible for an Erasmus Plus study mobility, you must meet the following conditions:

- You must have a minimum academic average of seven out of ten
- You must have completed at least seventy percent of the total number of mandatory credits at the time of application. Credits from optional or special courses are not considered

## **How to Apply?**

The application process is clear and well organized. Here are the steps you need to follow:

### **Step one**

Choose a study program abroad that can be academically recognized and matched with your current degree requirements.

### **Step two**

Prepare your application file, which must include the following documents:

- A motivation letter written in English
- A learning agreement or study plan written in English
- A curriculum vitae written in English
- Optionally, a letter of recommendation written in English or Romanian by a faculty member

## Step three

Take a language test and attend an interview in the language spoken in the host country. This may be English, French, German, Italian, or Spanish. If you already hold a valid language certificate, you'll only take part in the interview. Once accepted, all that remains is to pack your bags and get ready for an unforgettable academic and cultural adventure.

## Language Support Provided by Erasmus Plus

As part of the program, you will receive free access to the Online Linguistic Support platform, also known as OLS. Through this platform, you can:

- Take online language courses in the language of the host country. For example, you can learn Spanish even if your courses are taught in English
- Practice with interactive exercises and take progress tests
- Improve your language skills in a flexible and personalized way

## Selection Process

There are two main selection periods each year, which usually take place in February to March and in June.

Candidates are selected based on the following criteria:

- Academic grades count for fifty percent of the final score
- Language competence test counts for thirty percent
- Interview in the language of the host institution counts for twenty percent

To be considered eligible, your final score must be at least five out of ten.

## Financial Support from Erasmus Plus

The monthly scholarship amount depends on the destination country and the length of your mobility. The financial support is provided in two payments:

- The first payment represents eighty percent of the total grant and is transferred at the beginning of your stay abroad
- The second payment of twenty percent is transferred at the end of the mobility, once you have fulfilled all academic and administrative obligations

## Travel Grant

In addition to the monthly scholarship, Erasmus Plus offers a travel grant calculated based on the distance between the Bucharest University of Economic Studies and your host university. This calculation is done using the official Erasmus Plus distance tool.

There are two types of travel support:

- Green travel, for environmentally friendly transport methods such as trains, buses, or car sharing
- Regular travel, for other means such as airplanes or personal vehicles

Erasmus Plus offers reliable financial assistance that matches the duration of your studies abroad and your travel choices.

## S3:E7 “WHAT COMES AFTER GRADUATING FROM UNIVERSITY?”

### **Have you completed your bachelor's degree and are now wondering what's next?**

The Bucharest University of Economic Studies (ASE) offers a wide range of opportunities to continue your studies. Across its 12 faculties, there are over 90 master's programs, and the university is nationally recognized as a leader in business education (according to the U-Multirank ranking).

You can choose between two types of master's degrees:

- A research-oriented master's, designed for those who wish to deepen their knowledge in their field of study and pursue an academic path.
- A professional master's, ideal if you want to enter the labour market and broaden your practical skills.

Master's courses are typically held in the afternoon (starting at 4:30 PM, 6:00 PM, or 7:30 PM), making them convenient for those who are also working.

After a master's degree, the next academic stage is a PhD, the highest level of academic achievement. A doctorate gives you the chance to become an expert in your field and to develop advanced research, analytical, and leadership skills. PhD graduates have access to top positions in academia, research, public institutions, and companies that seek innovators and high-level specialists.

Throughout the doctoral program, you will attend conferences, publish scientific articles, and collaborate with experts from around the world. You will also have the opportunity to contribute to the advancement of knowledge in your field, develop critical thinking, and build a valuable professional network. A PhD is not only an academic stage but also a formative experience that shapes you in the long run, offering new career perspectives and the satisfaction of making a significant contribution to society.

Completing the three cycles of higher education represents a full academic journey. Each stage has its purpose: the bachelor's degree provides the foundational knowledge, the master's degree deepens expertise and develops advanced skills, while the PhD opens the path to research and academic excellence. The decision to continue your studies depends on each student's personal and professional goals, but together these cycles form the highest level of academic training.



## ALUMNI ASE

Graduation is a very important moment for any student. It marks a very important step in gaining the competencies needed to successfully practice our professions as economists. But it is not the moment to forget the university! We are here, representing the alma mater, through the alumni association that we are proud of and with whom we want to maintain a close collaborative relationship.



We aim for the beauty and charm of the friendships made during university years to strengthen over time and we encourage all graduates, as well as students, to stay close to the Alumni ASE community.

## How did it all begin?

In 1920, the Association of Graduates of the Academy of Commercial and Industrial Studies (ALACI), the predecessor of today's Alumni ASE organization, was founded. It was a strong organization that aimed to strengthen the bonds of solidarity and friendships between the academy's graduates and to defend the general interests of its members.

Since 2007, the Alumni ASE Association accepted the challenge of successfully resuming its activity. The main goal of the organization is to help create and strengthen relationships between ASE graduates from all graduating classes and study programs and to promote collaborative relationships between ASE and its alumni.

In addition, the Association's activity aims to promote collaboration between the university and its graduates, the continuous assessment of improving the education system and the rapid adaptation of economists training to market demands, the promotion of the image of ASE Bucharest and its graduates, and, last but not least, the promotion of scientific research and the support of alumni activities in this regard.



## What does the Alumni ASE Association aim to do?

First and foremost, we seek to support the strengthening of ties between ASE graduates, regardless of their graduating class, study program, or form of education, as well as the development of solid partnerships between the university and its alumni community. At the same time, we aim for the constant improvement of the educational system and the rapid adaptation of economists' training to the demands of the labour market, along with promoting the image of the Bucharest University of Economic Studies and its graduates. The Alumni ASE Association has created valuable partnerships that facilitate student interaction with the professional and economic environment, connecting them directly with business representatives and helping to strengthen the practical dimension of the educational process. Established initiatives include: **thematic workshops** organized with graduates and specialists from the economic and social environment, the **National Forum of Economists in Training**, the **National Forum of Economists in Romania**, the **ASE Alumni Gala**, and the **ASE Job & Internship Fair**, an event dedicated to career and internship opportunities, organised under the support of the Bucharest University of Economic Studies (ASE), in partnership with the Union of ASE Students (USASE), the ASE Foundation, and the Association of Faculties of Economics in Romania (AFER).

### AFER

The **Association of Faculties of Economics in Romania (AFER)** is a professional-scientific, non-governmental, non-partisan, non-profit organization, with **58 members** from all over the country, including faculties of economics and professional organisations.



Since 2017, the Association has initiated and annually organises the National Forum of Economists in Romania (FNER), a large-scale event that brings together deans and representatives of faculties of economic sciences from across the country, along with representatives of prestigious public institutions and private organisations. Since 2022, AFER has proudly organised the National Forum of Economists in Training, an event dedicated to young people, structured in thematic sections, where they can debate the competencies required for graduates to integrate into the labor market, for research and innovation activities, and for the development of entrepreneurship.

One of the fundamental directions of action of the Association of Faculties of Economics in Romania is to stimulate excellence in the scientific and professional training of students. This involves deepening research skills in the field of economic sciences, developing teamwork and communication skills, the ability to evaluate, and cultivating a competitive spirit. Keeping this in mind, AFER annually organises the National Olympiad of Economists in Training, a framework designed to offer students from all over the country the opportunity to present scientific papers prepared during the academic year (within the scientific communications competition), as well as entrepreneurship projects and business plans they wish to develop in the future. AFER aims to develop and improve economic higher education in Romania in the spirit of European reform. Annually, they organise conferences, and debates on current economic topics through its member faculties.



## S3:E9 “SCIENTIFIC COMMUNICATIONS SESSION”

The Student Scientific Session at the Bucharest University of Economic Studies is a traditional academic event, organized annually to offer students the opportunity to present their research and develop their skills. It is not just a forum for presentation, but a complex training process that combines research, critical thinking, and academic communication.

### How it works?

Participation involves several stages:

1. **Paper drafting** - under the guidance of a faculty member, the student prepares a scientific paper on a chosen topic. The coordinating professor provides methodological support and validates the academic quality.
2. **Public presentation** - the paper is presented before a committee as well as fellow students, offering the chance to practice academic discourse and respond to critical questions.
3. **Thematic flexibility** - students may participate in any section, regardless of their faculty of origin, thus encouraging interdisciplinary collaboration.

### Participation brings significant advantages:

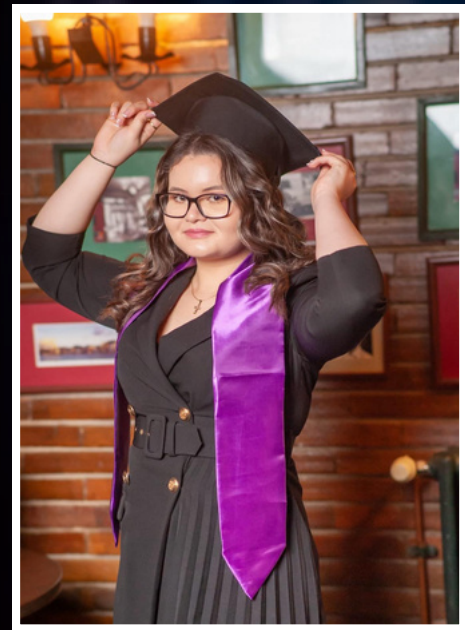
- deepening knowledge and applying scientific methodology;
- developing presentation and argumentation skills;
- valuable feedback from professors and peers;
- strengthening self-confidence and critical thinking;
- creating professional connections and mentorship opportunities;
- added value to the CV, useful for master's, doctoral studies, or career prospects.

The best papers are rewarded with diplomas, distinctions, and prizes, while some are selected for national competitions:

- National Olympiad of Future Economists (ONEF) – the most prestigious competition in the field, for both undergraduate and master's students;
- GoBiz Competition – organized by FABIZ, offering direct access to the business plan section within ONEF.



"Participation in the Scientific Communications Session was for me more than just an academic presentation; it was an exercise in self-discovery. I learned what it means to structure ideas, support my point of view with arguments, and convey them clearly and convincingly. At the same time, I discovered that emotions can become an ally when transformed into motivation. Another important gain was the interaction with colleagues and professors-the exchange of ideas and perspectives that made me realize how much we can learn from each other. The experience helped me view research not as a compulsory task, but as an opportunity to explore, create, and connect with areas of personal and professional interest. I believe the true value of the Session does not lie only in diplomas or awards, but in that sense of achievement when you realize you are capable of more than you thought. For this reason, I wholeheartedly recommend participating in this activity, as it opens doors and develops essential skills not only for an academic career but also for everyday life."

## S3:E 10 “THE UNIVERSITY ETHICS COMMITTEE”

The University Ethics Committee of the Bucharest University of Economic Studies is an important structure within the institution, playing a role in promoting and ensuring an academic environment based on integrity and adherence to the norms of university ethics and deontology, in accordance with legal regulations, principles, values, and the mission of ASE.

The committee operates in accordance with the Code of Ethics and University Deontology, an integral part of the ASE Charter, aiming to provide a framework in which teaching and research activities are conducted transparently, fairly, and responsibly.

The Ethics Committee is responsible for ensuring compliance with and applying the ethical principles that govern the university community. Among the main objectives of the committee are preventing and combating unethical behavior, managing cases of misconduct, and promoting an academic culture based on integrity and respect. It contributes to maintaining a healthy educational environment by sanctioning violations and providing guidance to all members of the academic community.

The Ethics Committee has a deliberative and independent nature, consisting of academic staff and student representatives. The members of the committee do not hold administrative roles in the university's leadership, thus ensuring an objective and impartial evaluation of submitted cases.

Any person from the academic community, as well as external individuals, may submit a complaint to the Ethics Committee when they believe that ethical norms have been violated. Complaints will be submitted in writing or online and they must include specific information and evidence to support the claims. These complaints CANNOT be anonymous. After evaluating each case, the Ethics Committee issues a decision that may include sanctions, recommendations, or corrective measures.

Have you ever imagined yourself teaching? If you are passionate about sharing knowledge and would like to pursue a career in education, the Bucharest University of Economic Studies (ASE) offers support through the Department for Teacher Training (DPPD).

This department, dedicated exclusively to psycho-pedagogical training, provides the methodological preparation needed by students and graduates of higher education who choose a teaching career. You can find more details on the website: [www.dppd.ase.ro](http://www.dppd.ase.ro).

The psychopedagogical training programme includes optional courses, separate from those in the main field of study, and is intended for students preparing for a teaching career. Through this programme, participants develop the necessary skills for carrying out educational activities in pre-university education, in line with current legislation. The programme is free of charge for students enrolled in tuition-free (budget-funded) places, while for those paying tuition fees the cost is 250 lei/semester at the bachelor level and 500 lei/semester at the master level.

DPPD study programs:

- Bachelor's cycle - Level I (initial): grants graduates the right to teach in early childhood, preschool, primary, lower secondary, and the first years of high school.
- Level II (advanced): designed for graduates who wish to teach in upper secondary education or post-secondary schools. The initial training program, completed with a graduation certificate, is a mandatory step in obtaining the status of a qualified teacher.

For graduates who did not complete the psycho-pedagogical training programme during their bachelor's or master's studies, there is the possibility to continue their preparation through postgraduate psycho-pedagogical training programmes. These provide the necessary competences for practicing the teaching profession and are organized in accordance with national standards and methodologies.

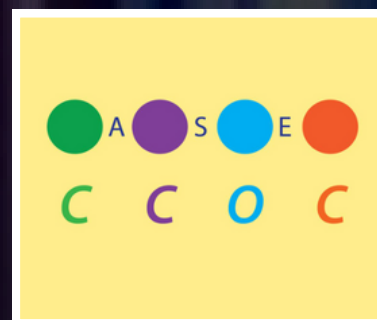

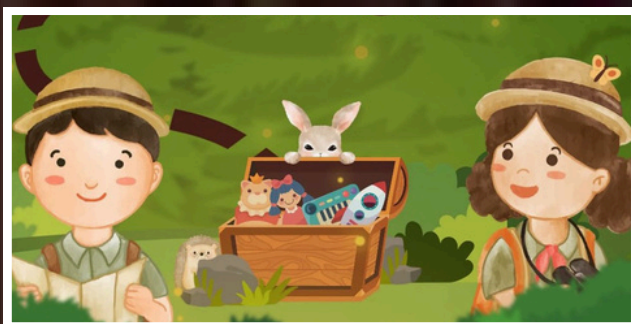
## Bucharest Summer University

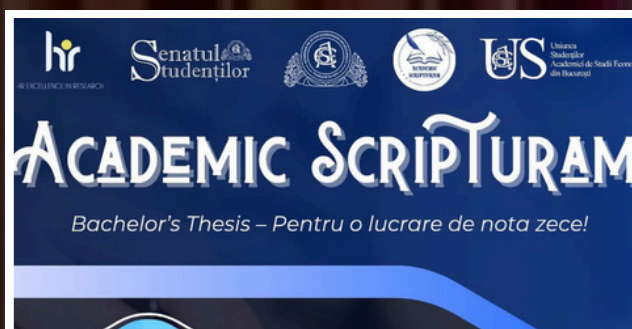
## Youth Entrepreneurship School

A project created to help students quickly access useful information about student representation, scholarships, final papers, exam sessions, and other academic matters. Through concise posts on social media, USASE makes information accessible in a friendly and easy-to-understand way.



## Lions Student Hub

Lions Student Hub is a new project within USASE, carried out in collaboration with Generali Romania, through which students can enhance their financial literacy. Participants will learn how to protect their finances, make informed decisions, and optimize their personal budget with the help of practical advice provided by specialists. The project takes place in two stages:

1. The Introductory Workshop, where students take part in interactive sessions and have the chance to secure a spot in the second stage of the project, which takes place in Predeal.
2. The Generali Bootcamp, where practical experience is combined with the development of planning and communication skills.



## S4:E4 “BUCHAREST SUMMER UNIVERSITY”

**Bucharest Summer University** is the official summer school of the Bucharest University of Economic Studies, organized annually by the Union of Students of the Bucharest University of Economic Studies (USASE) and the Students’ Senate of ASE, under the academic mentorship of one of our university’s 12 faculties.

BSU is the perfect opportunity for international students to discover Romania, explore diverse cultures, and create friendships that go beyond borders.

This cultural and academic event takes place every year in August, in Bucharest. Alongside the two weeks of courses, this year’s theme being “**Marketing in the AI Era**”, the project represents a valuable opportunity for participants’ personal development, through a variety of activities designed especially for them.

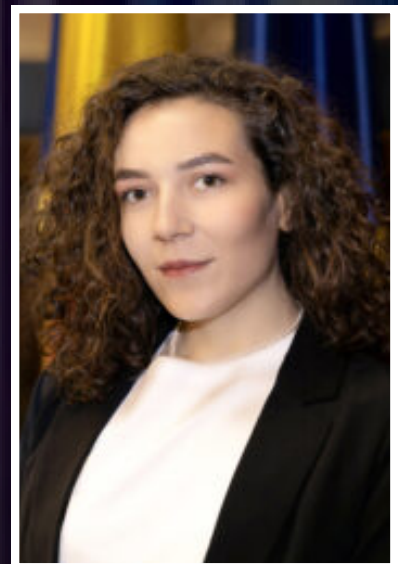

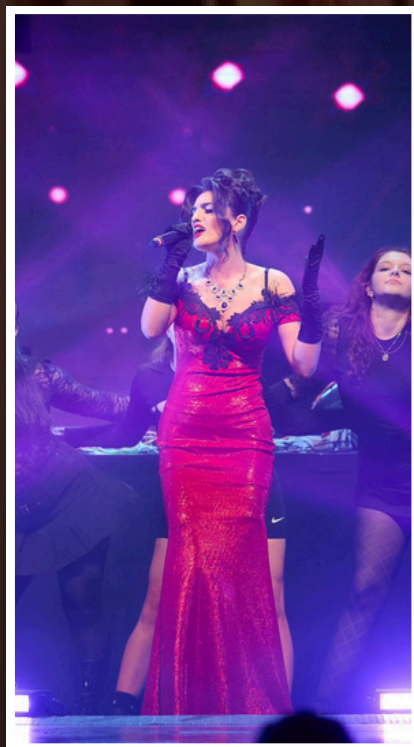
## **“How would you describe your experience at the Freshmen’s Ball?”**

## S4:E6 “RELAXATION IN BUCHAREST”

Student life at ASE means courses, seminars, projects, and sometimes a pace that leaves little room for a breather. However, right in the heart of Bucharest, just a few steps away from lecture halls and the library, Piața Romană hides a series of perfect spots for relaxation breaks. Cozy cafés, hidden urban gardens, or bohemian venues become ideal landmarks for escaping even for just an hour from the academic routine. In the following lines, we will discover some of these less mainstream places, favored by students for their intimate and creative vibe, where time seems to flow more slowly and energy is naturally recharged.

- **Cafelier** – a small café tucked away on Lascăr Catargiu Boulevard, where specialty coffee and a quiet atmosphere attract students who want to read or work in an intimate setting.
- **UrBarn** – a space with unconventional design that brings the rustic charm of the countryside into the middle of the city. It is the ideal place for those looking for a mix of urban and nature, suitable for informal meetings or laptop work sessions.
- **Cream Dream** – a sweet little refuge, known for its creative desserts and relaxed atmosphere. Perfect for long breaks after classes, when you want to treat yourself to something colorful and delicious.
- **The Coffee Shop Mendeleev** – with a minimalist design and a calm atmosphere, this café is often chosen by students for relaxed conversations, brainstorming, or simple moments of rest between seminars.
- **Cafe Verona** – hidden in the garden of the Cărturești Bookstore, it is a true green oasis right in the center of Bucharest. Students come here for the bohemian air, the mix of culture and relaxation, and for the feeling of “escaping” the hustle and bustle of Piața Romană.





Last but not least, Bucharest is not only about university life and the fast pace of the capital, but also about numerous spaces dedicated to relaxation:

- **Cișmigiu Park** – the oldest park in Bucharest, located right in the city center, offering an ideal setting for peaceful walks or gatherings with friends. The lake and lush vegetation create a calm atmosphere, while its proximity to universities makes it one of the most accessible options for students.
- **Herăstrău Park (King Mihai I Park)** – the largest park in the capital, suitable for cycling, jogging, or relaxing by the lake. The terraces and leisure areas attract many young people, turning it into a place where nature blends with social life.
- **Tineretului Park** – known for its vast size and for hosting various events, it is a favorite among students for picnics, sports activities, or simply taking a break outdoors.
- **Botanical Garden** – a haven of peace, perfect for those looking for a more secluded space. Its plant collections and green alleys provide a relaxing setting, away from the urban hustle.
- **Carol I Park** – a place where nature and history intertwine, thanks to its monuments and landscapes. It is well suited for longer walks, but also for moments of reflection.

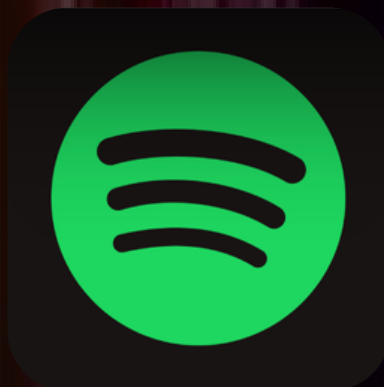
